



**Breakthrough: building human rights culture

It's an exciting and proud moment for [Breakthrough](#), as one of our most compelling video stories '[death by Detention](#)' has been voted the winner in the 2009 [DoGooderTv Nonprofit Video Awards](#).

DoGooderTV enables nonprofit organizations to present new videos and existing media assets to new audiences. Breakthrough's video was short-listed from 400 videos submitted by 175 organizations that use video to ignite social change. Thousands voted and Breakthrough's 'death by Detention' received the most popular votes in long form category.

Breakthrough's video documents a moving personal testimony that tells the story of Sandra Kenley, a 52-year-old grandmother, who after living in the U.S. legally for 33 years, died in inhumane conditions in immigration detention.

Currently, immigrant detention centers are detaining 300,000 legal and undocumented immigrants, many who have not committed a single crime. For an indefinite amount of time, they are subjected to unlawful, inhumane, degrading punishment, which violates their due process and violates their human rights.
