New York City is creating a massive video surveillance infrastructure and the proliferation of video surveillance cameras in the absence of legal or regulatory constraint has profound implications for basic rights and liberties. “Who’s Watching? Video Camera Surveillance in New York City and the Need for Public Oversight,” documents a sharp increase in the number of video surveillance cameras on Manhattan streets and makes recommendations for a series of steps that the City Council should follow.
